What learning outcome are you assessing?	<p>Course Learning Outcome</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Application of assessment, triage, and treatment of patients suffering an endocrine emergency with typical and atypical clinical presentations.
Describe the learning opportunity you provided to students to help them achieve the learning outcome.	<p>I provided a video of endocrine emergency and followed that up by answering questions about the video and then provided subsequent lecture enhancing the topic.</p> <p>This didactic information was then followed up with a lab evaluation of patients presenting with endocrine emergencies.</p>
Classroom Assessment Technique Used	<p>Student-generated test questions</p> <p>Allow students to write test questions and model answers for specified topics, in a format consistent with course exams. This will give students the opportunity to evaluate the course topics, reflect on what they understand, and what are good test items.</p>
What did the assessment data reveal about student learning?	<p>The students, based from the Student-generated test questions, appeared to be clear regarding the clinical presentation of typical and atypical clinical presentations of endocrine emergencies.</p>
How did you use the results to improve learning?	<p>I evaluated the questions and used the good ones as prompts for discussion. I modified with slight revisions and used the questions on the upcoming exam.</p>
Evidence of Improved Learning	<p>I reviewed the exam questions that were submitted and revised and concluded that the students have a comprehension of the material they were asked to generate questions for.</p>
