With a woman needed intubated, compressions, an IO drilled, and life-saving medicine while her sister watched over the situation crying. With my crew and I remaining calm, because that's what we were taught to do, and using our heads, because again... that's what my professor stressed to us in class, we were able to regain pulses and transport this woman to the hospital alive.

Excited with this feeling, I contacted Professor Lippert, and he, like usual, contacted right back excited too! This is just one of the many moments I used the skills and teachings learned from the unique teaching style of Professor Lippert.

I have to stress, the patience he displayed every class. If students do not understand a subject, Professor Lippert will make himself available and go through it until it is understood. No signs of frustrations, or annoyance. He is very intelligent and confident in what he is teaching. He builds great repour and is understanding of the stress of the program. He helped me figure out solutions many times to my schedule conflicts with being a single mother still working full time and trying to complete my hours. He remains professional at all times and creates a very comfortable classroom experience.
